

Outdoor Recreation Legacy Partnership Program

Round 7 Selected Projects

ALABAMA

Downtown Gadsden Greenway, Gadsden

The City of Gadsden will receive \$2,996,000 to support the development of the Downtown Gadsden Greenway. Improvements to include an accessible trail for residents along the Tuscaloosa Avenue corridor, formerly a stretch of retired rail bed.

CALIFORNIA

Campus Park, Oxnard

The City of Oxnard will receive \$6,700,000 to support the development of Campus Park. Improvements include a skate park, bicycle pump track, Pelota Mixteca court, inclusive playground, community garden, basketball court, and related site improvements.

La Palma Park, Anaheim

The City of Anaheim will receive \$6,000,000 to support the renovation of the currently blighted western half of La Palma Park. Improvements include shaded, accessible picnic areas, universally inclusive nature-themed playground, exercise stations, walking paths, entry promenade, open-air arena, multi-purpose field, new native trees and drought-tolerant landscaping, security lighting, a restroom and storage facility, and other new support amenities.

Martin Luther King Jr. Park, Bakersfield

The City of Bakersfield will receive \$11,909,000 to support the renovation of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Park. Improvements include the installation of multi-purpose sports fields to accommodate different age and skill levels, a splash pad, shaded play areas, new amphitheater for community events, community garden, water-efficient irrigation, lighting, planting drought tolerant trees, and nature-based landscape design.

Bryte Park, West Sacramento

The City of West Sacramento will receive \$15,000,000 to support the acquisition of 24+ acres and the development and renovation of Bryte Park. Improvements include a new aquatics facility and splash pad, new dog park, renovated playfields, a new all-weather soccer field with lighting, new amphitheater, renovated tennis courts, renovated basketball court, new fitness stations, walking loops, new inclusive restroom building, new parks maintenance building and yard, new trees and landscaping, and additional parking.

Spartan-Keyes Park, San Jose

The City of San Jose will receive \$4,500,000 to support the development of Spartan-Keyes Park. Improvements include unprogrammed open space, nature-themed playground amenities, urban forest preservation, native landscapes, pollinator gardens, quiet contemplative space, active recreation areas, community event plaza, and sporting venue.

Central Park, Glendale

The City of Glendale will receive \$5,950,000 to support the renovation of Central Park. Improvements include removing surface parking to improve the environment and expanding

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outdoor recreation opportunities and greenspace to provide for a new nature-themed playground, outdoor reading areas, splash pad, walking paths, fitness stations, and planting trees.

Roadside Park, Baldwin Park

The City of Baldwin Park will receive \$2,109,000 to support the development of Roadside Park. Improvements include greenspace development of the 1.27-acre site by constructing a nature-based playground with a shade sail, gathering areas, seating, a boulder formation, a fitness station, a restroom, open space, bioswales and onsite detention basins that will collect rainwater and provide groundwater recharge, permeable pavement, shade trees, native landscaping, and pollinator garden.

Jordan Downs Central Park, County of Los Angeles

The County of Los Angeles will receive \$10,999,000 to support the development of Jordan Downs Central Park. Improvements include a flexible lawn meadow that will double as a soccer futsal field, two basketball courts, walking paths, lighting, seating options, native landscaping, bioswales, and an accessible community pool.

Panorama Park, Redding

The City of Redding will receive \$4,000,000 to support the development of 10.53-acre Panorama Park. Improvements include a children's adventure park, wetland habitat, lighted skate park, shade structure, parking, a lighted multi-use sports field designed for soccer, football, and softball, a dog park (with small and large dog areas), lighted walking trails, and a disc golf practice area.

Van Buskirk Revitalization Park, Stockton

The City of Stockton will receive \$7,017,000 to support the renovation of Van Buskirk Park. Improvements include a nature-based water play/splash pad, a community garden, new multipurpose lawn/field, planting of shade trees, green space, two new basketball courts, a skate park, bike trails, and BMX track.

Puente Hills Landfill Park, County of Los Angeles

The County of Los Angeles will receive \$15,000,000 to support the development of 40-acres on a previous 1,365-acre landfill into Puente Hills Landfill Regional Park. Improvements to include the creation of a children's nature play area, community amphitheater, art plaza, dog run, picnic areas, ceremonial space, interpretive gardens, several open space areas designated as flexible community gathering spaces, trails, sidewalks, and related improvements.

Stewart Park, Beaumont

The City of Beaumont will receive \$3,100,000 to support the renovation of Stewart Park. Improvements to include accessible playgrounds, basketball and pickleball courts, a nature-themed Parkour Park with boulder-like equipment, and an outdoor stage.

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Quail Valley Nature Park, Menifee

The City of Menifee will receive \$750,000 to support the acquisition and development of Quail Valley Nature Park. Improvements include a nature-based playground, fitness area, gathering space, park shelter/gazebo, walking/nature trails, open space, safety improvements, and lighting.

Bellflower Park, Adelanto

The City of Adelanto will receive \$1,000,000 to support the development of Bellflower Park. Improvements include green and blue spaces including nature-based shaded walking paths, lighting, parents lounge, playground, picnic area, fountain and water splash, parents lounge, multi-sports game court, reading lawn center, Zen Garden, restrooms, drought-tolerant plantings that will help to cool the air, reduce pollution, and have positive effects on mental and physical health.

Veterans Memorial Park, La Puente

The City of La Puente will receive \$1,000,000 to support the development of Veterans Memorial Park. Improvements include an open green space, a walking path, a picnic area, a tranquility garden, a meditation/yoga deck, accessible seating, and native drought-tolerant landscaping.

COLORADO

La Alma-Lincoln Park, Denver

The City of Denver will receive \$8,400,000 to support the renovation of La Alma-Lincoln Park. Improvements include exercise and cultural story trail, skate park, playground, picnic grove, tennis courts, basketball courts, and related site improvements.

Gold Strike Park, Arvada

The City of Arvada will receive \$7,329,000 to support the renovation of Gold Strike Park. Improvements include accessible site design and amenities, improved habitat, the establishment of a wildlife corridor, and a revitalized creek corridor to provide flood mitigation and climate change resilience.

CONNECTICUT

Cummings Park/West Beach, Stamford

The City of Stamford will receive \$5,000,000 to support the renovation of Cummings Park and West Beach. Improvements include enhanced parking, new plaza, renovating restrooms and park maintenance/storage facilities, new tennis and pickleball courts, developing a multi-use recreation space, a new softball field, scour wall, repairs to the beach promenade, renovation to the pavilion restrooms, outdoor showers, and a lifeguard storage area.

Rockwell Park, Bristol

The City of Bristol will receive \$1,930,000 to support the renovation of Rockwell Park. Improvements include splash pad renovation, playground renovation, pool and bathhouse

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improvements, ADA improvements, a new fitness track, field improvements, updated lighting, and a disc golf course.

DISTRICT OF COLUMBIA

11th Street Bridge Park, Washington, D.C.

Washington, D.C. will receive \$15,000,000 to support the development of new elevated park on the Anacostia River. Improvements include multi-generational playscapes, hammock grove, native plantings, and related site improvements.

FLORIDA

Carter Park, Fort Lauderdale

The City of Fort Lauderdale will receive \$2,181,000 to support the renovation of Carter Park. Improvements include a new playground with shade structure, fitness station, basketball courts with shade structure, bleachers, improved parking, trails and sidewalks, splash pad, swimming pool, synthetic turf fields, and accessibility improvements.

Sunset Park, Hollywood

The City of Hollywood will receive \$7,581,000 to support the development of Sunset Park through the repurposing of a former golf course. Improvements include updated lighting, a boardwalk, play areas, stormwater improvements, an event plaza, a kayak launch, a fishing pier, a multipurpose trail, and new restrooms.

Marva Bannerman Park, Miami-Dade County

Miami-Dade County will receive \$2,518,000 to support the renovation of the pool at Marva Bannerman Park. Improvements include a new pool control building, a new 75' x 51' pool and deck with an adjacent zero entry pool, also known as a 'beach-entry pool' to create a seamless and all-accessible transition between land and water, and a splash pad.

City Park, Oakland Park

The City of Oakland Park will receive \$2,500,000 to support the renovation of City Park. Improvements include installing a new amphitheater, building multi-use trails, picnic facilities, security lighting, updated landscaping, stormwater management updates, and a renovated parking area.

GEORGIA

Burdett Park Natural Area, South Fulton

The City of South Fulton will receive \$1,081,000 to support the renovation of Burdett Park. Improvements include developing undeveloped land in the existing park with new trails, bridges, boardwalks, and seating areas.

IOWA

Comiskey Park, Dubuque

The City of Dubuque will receive \$1,974,000 to support the renovation of Comiskey Park.

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improvements include a new basketball court, skate spot, tennis court, multi-use playing field, trails, revitalized entrances, parking, and native landscaping.

KENTUCKY

Riverfront Park, Barren River, Bowling Green

The City of Bowling Green will receive \$3,640,000 to support the development of Barren River Riverfront Park. Improvements include access through removing a sieve (an extremely dangerous river hazard that consists of water flowing under rock, which poses a significant drowning hazard), riverbank stabilization, riparian zone restoration, a boat access ramp, a driveway and parking lot, fishing habitat improvements, sidewalks, signage, trash receptacles, seating, landscaping, pathways/walkways, boulder seating and steps, utilities, lighting, and site furnishings.

MARYLAND

Baltimore Greenway Trail Network, Baltimore

The City of Baltimore will receive \$1,375,000 to support the acquisition of six land parcels that will contribute to the 35-mile Baltimore Greenway Trail Network. Improvements include approximately 1.8 miles of multipurpose trails and provide a linear park to disadvantaged areas of Baltimore City.

Hill Street Park, Frederick

The City of Frederick will receive \$1,000,000 to support the renovation of Hill Street Park. Improvements include rehabilitation of the existing skate park.

MICHIGAN

Flint Riverbank Park, Genesee County (Flint)

The City of Flint will receive \$5,000,000 to support the renovation of Flint Riverbank Park. Improvements include public access to the current "in river" restoration project at the Flint River which will provide access for the first time in more than half a century, safety improvements and access improvements to the river, and upland amenities consisting of pavilions, picnic and seating options, bike racks, barbeque stations, new and renovated restroom facilities, sidewalks, accessible pathways and ramps, fitness station, lighting, and green infrastructure.

MINNESOTA

Dr Martin Luther King Jr. (MLK) Park, Rochester

The City of Rochester will receive \$1,522,000 to support the renovation of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Park. Improvements include the installation of a new full basketball court with lighting, resurfacing of existing basketball courts and the addition of lighting, installation of accessible playground, accessibility improvements, splash pad, picnic shelter, entertainment plaza, utilities for vendors and events, and the expansion of the Community Food and Learning Garden.

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MISSOURI

Parr Hill Park, Joplin

The City of Joplin will receive \$485,000 to support the renovation of Parr Hill Park. Improvements include replacing two existing playground structures with new all-inclusive playground structures, installing new surfacing at a third existing playground structure, replacing existing outdoor fitness equipment with stationary outdoor fitness equipment along the Parr Hill Park Trail, permanent outdoor games, accessible sidewalks, and resurfacing the existing basketball court to convert to a multi-use court.

NORTH CAROLINA

Deaverview Mountain Acquisition, Buncombe County (Asheville)

Buncombe County will receive \$4,475,000 to support the 345-acre acquisition of property at Deaverview Mountain that will become a new passive recreation park and immersive nature opportunity for hiking, nature viewing, and picnicking for the surrounding communities.

NORTH DAKOTA

Downtown Gateway and Greenway, Grand Forks

The City of Grand Forks will receive \$3,490,000 to support the development of the Downtown Gateway and Greenway. Improvements include a new trail, monument signage, nature promenade, park shelter, and play area.

Turtle Mountain Family Recreation Areas, Belcourt

The City of Belcourt will receive \$1,000,000 to support the development of Turtle Mountain Family Recreation Areas. Improvements include the construction of five picnic and playground areas in housing sites located on the Turtle Mountain Indian Reservation.

NEW MEXICO

Mesa Verde Park, Albuquerque

The City of Albuquerque will receive \$1,350,000 to support the renovation of Mesa Verde Park. Improvements include a new accessible playground, nature play structures, futsal court, pickleball courts, dog park, shade structures, access improvements and walking paths, shade trees, pollinator garden, updated lighting, and irrigation.

NEW YORK

Payne Park, North Tonawanda

The City of North Tonawanda will receive \$4,084,000 to support the renovation of the pool at Payne Park. Improvements include a lap pool, a new pool deck, shade structures, and other site and safety improvements.

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OHIO

Reverend H.V. Savage Park, Toledo

The City of Toledo will receive \$1,151,000 to support the renovation of Reverend H.V. Savage Park. Improvements include accessibility improvements, addressing safety risks, an open-air shelter, repairing existing play facilities, improving public access and enjoyment of the native tree canopy, and incorporating nature-based solutions for stormwater management with interpretive signage.

Irishtown Bend, Cleveland

The City of Cleveland will receive \$10,813,000 to support the acquisition and development of 25-acre Irishtown Bend Park. Improvements include accessible play space, public restrooms, grilling and picnic areas, a two-acre great lawn for events; more than 2 miles of pedestrian and bike trails; a nearly quarter-mile waterfront promenade with open walkways, seating areas, informal gathering spaces, and completes the last quarter mile of trail, linking more than 101 miles of the Ohio & Erie Canal Towpath Trail from the Cuyahoga Valley National Park to Lake Erie.

Cuyahoga Riverfront Property, Cleveland

The City of Cleveland will receive \$2,950,000 to support the acquisition of approximately 4.5 acres at the Cuyahoga Riverfront. Improvements include providing preservation and river access with further blue way access to Lake Erie and additional access to the adjacent +/-65-acre greenspace, Wendy Park.

Cain Park, Cleveland Heights

The City of Cleveland Heights will receive \$390,000 to support the renovation of Cain Park. Improvements include the renovation of the skate park and tennis courts.

OKLAHOMA

Dream Keepers Park, Tulsa

The City of Tulsa will receive \$3,612,000 to support the renovation of Dream Keepers Park. Improvements include safety improvements, access improvements, seating and other comfort options, and new design and landscaping elements reflective of the park's Native American namesake.

PENNSYLVANIA

Hillside Pool, Reading

The City of Reading will receive \$1,962,038 to support the renovation of Hillside Pool. Improvements include rehabilitation of the abandoned pool area, a new splash pad, concession area, renovated basketball court, parking improvements, and access improvements.

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Weston Field, Scranton

The City of Scranton will receive \$672,000 to support the renovation of Weston Field. Improvements include improved parking, improved access, wellness loop around existing soccer fields, new playground, pavilion, picnic and grilling areas, seating options, and green infrastructure.

SOUTH CAROLINA

Regional Park, Rock Hill

The City of Rock Hill will receive \$15,000,000 to support the development and renovation of Regional Park. Improvements include a multi-sport and recreation complex that will provide equitable access to quality sports facilities and catalyzing economic development for the region.

TENNESSEE

Gooch Park, Memphis

The City of Memphis will receive \$3,339,000 to support the renovation of Gooch Park. Improvements include turf football field with lighting, 1/2 mile walking track, playground, and the rehabilitation of existing outdoor pool.

TEXAS

Community Park, Dallas

The City of Dallas will receive \$8,663,000 to support the development of Community Park at Fair Park. Improvements include play areas with nature play and all abilities elements, comfort station, pavilion, and related site improvements.

Woodlawn Lake Park, San Antonio

The City of San Antonio will receive \$3,250,000 to support the renovation of Woodlawn Lake Park. Improvements include an accessible splashpad, planting of native trees with irrigation, grand terraced seating along the western shoreline of the lake, and fishing and overlook nodes around the lake.

Burnett Bayland Park, Harris County (Houston)

The City of Houston will receive \$11,353,000 to support the renovation of Burnett Bayland Park. Improvements include improvements to the parks underutilized 39-acre greenspace, a new splash pad, enlarged community gardens, rehabilitation to the existing skatepark, linear trails, inclusive playground, fitness equipment, multiple practice fields, sport courts, gateways, mitigation to existing access barriers and access improvements.

Teague Park, Longview

The City of Longview will receive \$1,318,000 to support the acquisition of 3+ acres and the development and renovation of Teague Park. Improvements include a new prominent entryway, improved access, an extension of the city's trail system, and an inclusive playground.

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John Trevino Jr. Metropolitan Park, Austin

The City of Austin will receive \$4,000,000 to support the development of John Treviño Jr. Metropolitan Park. Improvements include the installation of a nature playground, trails, site utilities, a restroom/pavilion, picnic facilities, a multi-use field, wildflower meadow, a dog park, site amenities, an access drive, and parking.

VIRGINIA

Patton Park, Petersburg

The City of Petersburg will receive \$3,407,000 to support the expansion acquisition and renovation of Patton Park. Improvements include enhanced access for the nature-based park at the intersection of two regional bicycle-pedestrian trail systems and along the shoreline of the Appomattox River, a State Designated Scenic River.

WASHINGTON

Uplands Park, Kent

The City of Dallas will receive \$3,150,000 to support the renovation of Uplands Park. Improvements include a spray park, a children's play area, restroom, entry plaza, picnic shelter, lighting, pathways, site furnishings, utilities, and landscaping improvements.
